

Overnight Detours Planned for the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation will implement overnight detours starting Sunday, February 7 as part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project.

U.S. 17 between Eastport Road and New Berlin Road will be temporarily closed Sunday, February 7 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. As shown in the map below, drivers on U.S. 17 southbound will be detoured onto Airport Center Drive, I-95 southbound to Busch Drive, where they can access U.S. 17. Drivers on U.S. 17 northbound will be detoured onto I-295 eastbound to Pulaski Road to I-295 westbound, where they can access U.S. 17.

The ramp from I-295 eastbound onto I-95 northbound is expected to be closed Monday, February 8 through Thursday, February 11 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured onto U.S. 17 and Airport Road where they can access I-95 northbound.





I-295 Eastbound to I-95 Northbound Detour

The ramp from I-295 eastbound onto I-95 southbound is expected to be closed Monday, February 8 and Wednesday, February 10 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured onto International Airport Boulevard and Airport Road where they can access I-95 southbound.
