Overnight Detours Scheduled Next Week as Part of FDOT's I-10 Widening Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT's I-10 from I-295 to I-95 widening project, closures and detours are scheduled at multiple interchanges within the project limits beginning Sunday, June 9 while crews perform bridge construction operations, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

I-10 West off-ramp to U.S. 17: The ramp will be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Thursday, June 13 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Traffic will be detoured to the McDuff Avenue exit, left on McDuff Avenue to U.S. 17.

I-10 West on-ramp from Irene Street (Stockton Street): The ramp may be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Thursday, June 13 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Traffic will detour to Edison Avenue.

I-10 West off-ramp to Cassat Avenue: The ramp will be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Tuesday, June 11 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Motorists will be detoured on I-10 to Lane Avenue, to Highway Avenue and back to Cassat Avenue to continue toward their destination.

I-10 West on-ramp from Cassat Avenue: The ramp will be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Tuesday, June 11 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Detour signage will assist motorists to an alternate route.

I-10 West off-ramp to McDuff Avenue: The ramp may be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Tuesday, June 11 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Traffic will be detoured to the Luna Street exit, then to Lenox Avenue and return to McDuff Avenue.

I-10 East off-ramp to Cassat Avenue: The ramp will be detoured nightly from Sunday, June 9 to Thursday, June 13 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Motorists will be detoured east on I-10 to McDuff Avenue where signage will direct them to Cassat Avenue.

I-10 West off-ramp to Luna Street: The ramp will be detoured nightly Wednesday, June 12 and Thursday, June 13 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Motorists will be detoured to Cassat Avenue, turning east on Highway Avenue and continue toward their destination.

I-10 West off-ramp to Lane Avenue: The ramp will be detoured nightly Wednesday, June 12 and Thursday, June 13 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Traffic will be detoured on I-10 to I-295 north to Commonwealth Avenue and return to Lane Avenue.

Superior Construction was awarded the \$174.5 million project to widen I-10 in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
