Overnight Detours on I-295 North Interchange Project Start Sunday

JACKSONVILLE, **Fla.** – As part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project, the Florida Department of Transportation will implement detours within project limits starting this Sunday, June 13, weather and schedule permitting.

Sunday, June 13 and Monday, June 14:

Crews will detour the I-295 eastbound ramp to I-95 northbound from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly. As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured to U.S. 17 and I-295 westbound to access I-95 northbound.



Sunday, June 13 through Thursday, June 17:

Crews will detour the I-95 southbound ramp onto I-295 westbound from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly. As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured onto I-295 eastbound to the U.S. 17 exit to access I-295 westbound.

Wednesday, June 16 and Thursday, June 17:

Crews will detour I-95 southbound between Max Leggett Parkway and Cole Road from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. As shown in the map below, drivers on I-95 southbound will be detoured onto Airport Road and I-95 northbound to the Pecan Park Road exit to access I-95 southbound.
