

## Overnight Ramp Detours Start Sunday Night at I-295 and I-95 North Interchange

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation will implement overnight detours starting Sunday as part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project.

The ramp from I-295 westbound to I-95 northbound is expected to be closed Sunday, December 20 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to U.S. 17 and Airport Center Drive to access I-95 northbound as shown in the map below.




The ramp from I-295 eastbound to I-95 southbound is expected to be closed Sunday, December 20 and Monday, December 21 from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to International Airport Boulevard and Airport Road to access I-95 southbound as shown in the map below.



The ramp from I-295 westbound to I-95 southbound is expected to be closed Sunday, December 20 from and Monday December 21 form 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to U.S. 17 and Busch Drive to access I-95 as shown in the map below.



This work is part of the I-95/I-295 North Interchange Operational Improvement project that includes a new collector-distributor system, auxiliary lanes and ramp improvements.
