Overnight Ramp Detours Start Tonight for I-10 Widening Project

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT’s project to widen I-10 from I-295 to I-95, overnight detours on I-10 ramps at Lane Avenue will begin tonight, April 19 at 10 p.m. Detours are scheduled for the Luna Street ramps Monday, April 26, weather and schedule permitting.

Monday, April 19:

The I-10 westbound on-ramp at Lane Avenue will be closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers attempting to access I-10 westbound will be detoured via Highway Avenue and Cassat Avenue or via Lane Avenue, Normandy Boulevard, Lenox Avenue and Cassat Avenue where they can access I-10 westbound.

The Lane Avenue exit ramp will be closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to the Cassat Avenue exit ramp onto Highway Avenue/Edgewood Avenue. Drivers may also detour onto I-295 westbound to the Commonwealth Avenue exit, where they can access Lane Avenue.

Monday, April 26:

The Luna Street exit ramp is expected to be closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to the Cassat Avenue exit ramp to Highway Avenue where they can access Luna Street.

The I-10 eastbound ramp at Luna Street is expected to be closed from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Drivers will be detoured to Rayford Street where they can access I-10 eastbound.

FDOT hired Superior Construction to complete this \$174.5 million project in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
