

Overnight Closure Planned at Lane Avenue, Park Street Intersection Tonight

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of FDOT’s Lane Avenue resurfacing project, a section of Lane Avenue north of the intersection with Park Avenue will be closed for overnight utility work from 8 p.m. Thursday, June 16 to 6:30 a.m. Friday, June 17, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Southbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn right onto Lenox Avenue, left onto Old Middleburg Road, left onto Manotak Avenue and back to Lane Avenue.

Northbound Lane Avenue Traffic: Drivers will turn right onto Park Street, left onto Cassat Avenue, left on Normandy Boulevard and back to Lane Avenue.
