Overnight Detour Planned for Westbound State Road 100 on Tuesday Night

STARKE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, westbound State Road 100 will see a detour from 8 p.m. Tuesday, June 6 to 6 a.m. Wednesday, June 7 for sewer repair, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

Overnight Westbound State Road 100 Nightly Detour on June 6: All westbound SR 100 through traffic will be detoured via SE 144th Street to U.S. 301. All westbound SR 100 local traffic between SE 144th Street and Water Street will be detoured left onto Laura Street, right onto Cherry Street, left onto South Street, right onto Thompson Street, and left on SR 100. Church Street and Cherry Street between South Street and SR 100 will be closed. Thompson Street will remain open at SR 100 for north/south traffic.

FDOT hired J.B. Coxwell Contracting to complete this \$23.6 million project in late 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
