### **Overnight Detour of Lane Avenue Planned Sunday and Monday**

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – As part of FDOT’s I-10 from I-295 to I-95 widening project, Lane Avenue at I-10 will be detoured Sunday, January 16 and Monday, January 17 from 10 p.m. until 5 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

**Lane Avenue North Detour:** Drivers will be detoured to I-10 east to the Cassat Avenue exit, left on Cassat Avenue and left on Beaver Street to reconnect with Lane Avenue.

**Lane Avenue South Detour:** Drivers will be detoured east on Highway Avenue, right on Cassat Avenue and right on Normandy Boulevard to reconnect with Lane Avenue.

**I-10 to Lane Avenue Exit Ramps:** Drivers who wish to exit I-10 at Lane Avenue will follow the detour signs in place and use either Beaver Street or Normandy Boulevard and Cassat Avenue to connect with Lane Avenue.

FDOT hired Superior Construction to complete this \$174.5 million project in early 2025, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

January is Move Over month in Florida. FDOT reminds motorists to move over for first responders or service vehicles displaying any visible signals while stopped on the roadside, including Road Rangers, sanitation vehicles and tow trucks.
