Overnight Detours and Daytime Closures Planned at I-95 South Exit Ramp to State Road 16

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, a daytime single-lane closure and overnight detour of the State Road 16 exit ramp from I-95 South is necessary for ramp reconstruction.

Overnight detours will occur on the exit ramp to State Road 16 from I-95 South and the on-ramp from State Road 16 to I-95 North on Sunday, Jan. 21, starting at 8 p.m. and will reopen by 6 a.m. the following morning.

During the overnight ramp closures, drivers on I-95 South will exit at State Road 207 and use I-95 North to access State Road 16. Drivers on State Road 16 will be detoured to I-95 South and exit at State Road 207 to access I-95 North. Motorists are encouraged to use caution in the area and follow posted detour signs during this time.

Also, the I-95 South exit ramp to State Road 16 will undergo a single lane closure from 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 23 through Thursday, Jan. 25 to safely complete ramp reconstruction.

Anderson Columbia Co. Inc. is estimated to complete the \$31 million resurfacing improvements by late 2024, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
