### Overnight Ramp Closures Planned Monday and Tuesday at Butler Boulevard and San Pablo Road Interchange

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Overnight closures of two ramps at the Butler Boulevard (State Road 202) and San Pablo Road interchange are planned for Monday, December 13 and Tuesday, December 14.

From 8 p.m. Monday, December 13 through 6 a.m. Tuesday, December 14, the ramp from eastbound Butler Boulevard to San Pablo Road will close, with traffic detoured to South Beach Parkway, where drivers can access westbound Butler Boulevard to exit onto San Pablo Road.

From 8 p.m. Tuesday, December 14 through 6 a.m. Wednesday, December 15, the ramp from San Pablo Road to eastbound Butler Boulevard close, with traffic detoured to westbound Butler Boulevard, where drivers can exit onto Hodges Boulevard to access eastbound Butler Boulevard.

Safe travels during the holidays will help ensure a happy holiday for you and your loved ones. Be sure to buckle up, don't drive distracted, and designate a sober driver.
