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REVISED: Nighttime Closures at U.S. 301 and I-10 Scheduled to Begin Monday

Jacksonville, Fla. – Detours originally scheduled to begin Sunday, June 16 on U.S. 301 at I-10 have been rescheduled to Monday, June 17 through Monday, July 1 from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The nightly closures are necessary to complete reconstruction work at the I-10 eastbound overpass.

The northbound U.S. 301 off-ramp from I-10 west will remain open to traffic.

The southbound U.S. 301 off-ramp from I-10 west will be closed to traffic.

- I-10 west to U.S. 301 traffic will detour to exit I-10 at State Road 228 (Exit 336) to I-10 east to travel south on U.S. 301.

U.S. 301 northbound off-ramp will be closed to traffic.

- The I-10 east off-ramp traffic to U.S. 301 north will detour to exit I-10 at State Road 23 (Exit 350B) and travel west on Beaver Street/U.S. 90.
- Northbound U.S. 301 traffic south of I-10 will detour to I-10 east to State Road 23 to west on Beaver Street.
- State Road 23 traffic wishing to travel north on U.S. 301 will detour to I-10 west and exit U.S. 301 northbound.

U.S. 301 south will be closed to traffic.

- The I-10 east off-ramp to southbound U.S. 301 will remain open to traffic.
- Southbound U.S. 301 traffic north of I-10 will detour to I-10 west, exit at State Road 228 and travel east on I-10 to southbound U.S. 301.
- State Road 23 traffic wishing to exit south on U.S. 301 will detour to I-10 west, exit at State Road 228 and travel east on I-10 to southbound U.S. 301.

Superior Construction Company began the \$65 million I-10 and U.S. 301 interchange improvement project in February 2016 and is estimated to complete the work in spring 2020.

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
