

Ramp Closure, Traffic Shift Planned for Ramp from San Pablo Road to Eastbound Butler Boulevard Next Week

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the interchange improvement project at Butler Boulevard and San Pablo Road, the ramp from San Pablo Road to eastbound Butler Boulevard will be closed 9 p.m. Wednesday, July 7 to 5 a.m. Thursday, July 8. Drivers will be detoured to westbound Butler Boulevard to the Hodges Boulevard exit, where they will be able to access eastbound Butler Boulevard (shown below).



When the ramp reopens on July 8, traffic on the ramp will be shifted to new pavement just south of the existing travel lanes.
