

### Ramp Closure, Traffic Shift on Ramp from San Pablo Road to Eastbound Butler Boulevard Rescheduled for July 15

**JACKSONVILLE, Fla.** – Due to unforeseen circumstances, the overnight closure of the ramp from San Pablo Road to eastbound Butler Boulevard has been rescheduled for 8 p.m. Thursday, July 15 to 5 a.m. Friday, July 16. Drivers will be detoured to westbound Butler Boulevard to the Hodges Boulevard exit, where they will be able to access eastbound Butler Boulevard (shown below).



When the ramp reopens on July 16, traffic on the ramp will be shifted to new pavement just south of the existing travel lanes.
