Ramp Closures on I-10, Hammond Boulevard and I-295 Scheduled Aug. 11 to Aug. 18

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of a resurfacing project on I-10 between Chaffee Road and I-295, drivers can expect nighttime ramp closures Sunday, Aug. 11 through Sunday, Aug. 18 for milling and resurfacing. The following closures are planned from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

During the closures, drivers should follow posted detour signage and use additional caution in the area.

- Sunday, Aug. 11 and Monday, Aug. 12, the eastbound I-10 ramp to Hammond Boulevard and the eastbound I-10 ramp to I-295 will be closed.
- Monday, Aug. 12 and Tuesday, Aug. 13, the southbound Hammond Boulevard ramp to I-10 eastbound and the southbound I-295 ramp to I-10 eastbound will be closed.
- Tuesday, Aug. 13 to Wednesday, Aug. 14, the northbound Hammond Boulevard ramp to I-10 eastbound and the northbound I-295 ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed.
- Wednesday, Aug. 14 and Thursday, Aug. 15, the westbound I-10 ramp to Hammond Boulevard will be closed.
- Wednesday, Aug. 14, Thursday, Aug. 15 and Sunday, Aug. 18, the southbound I-295 ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed.
- Thursday, Aug. 15 to Sunday, Aug. 18, the Hammond Boulevard ramp to I-10 westbound will be closed.
