Roadway Resurfacing Improvements on S.R. 206 Expected to Begin Tuesday

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation is scheduled to begin a resurfacing improvement project on State Road 206 (map below) from I-95 to the Intercoastal Waterway Bridge (ICWW) Tuesday, January 4, weather and schedule permitting.

The resurfacing improvements are part of routine maintenance work. This work will include drainage improvements, shoulder gutter installation, highway signing, guardrail, milling and paving the roadway, striping and other incidental construction work items. To safely complete the roadway work, nighttime lane closures will be necessary from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Preferred Materials, Inc. is expected to complete the \$5 million resurfacing project by summer 2022. Construction completion dates are fluid and subject to change based on weather and schedule permitting.

Be sure to buckle up, don't drive distracted, and designate a sober driver.


