

Southside Connector Northbound Lanes, Ramp to Regency Square Boulevard North Closed Overnight February 14 and February 15

Multiple lane closures also scheduled Sunday through Friday

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Southside Connector (State Road 113) northbound from Atlantic Boulevard/Arlington Expressway (State Road 115) to north of Tredinick Parkway and the northbound ramp to Regency Square Boulevard North will be closed overnight Monday, February 14 and Tuesday, February 15 from 7:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. The closures, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting, are needed for work related to the Southside Connector resurfacing and improvement project.

Depending on destination, traffic will detour via Atlantic Boulevard, Monument Road, Regency Square Boulevard North and the Southside Connector Service Road. Digital message boards and signs will be in place to direct drivers through the detour. (Closures and detour shown in map below.)
