St. Johns Avenue Detoured for JEA Sanitary Sewer Repair

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – St. Johns Avenue (State Road 211) between Riverside Avenue and Canterbury Street is currently closed to allow JEA crews to make critical sanitary sewer repairs in the area.

As shown in the map below, drivers will be detoured around the closure via Riverside Avenue and Canterbury Street.



This detour is expected to last three weeks, weather and schedule permitting, while JEA crews complete the sewer repairs. This work is unrelated to FDOT's ongoing State Road 211 Intersection Improvement Project. You can find out more about that project here: www.nflroads.com/SR211.
