State Road 100 Closure and Detour Planned Nightly March 12-14

STARKE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's Starke Railroad Overpass Interchange Improvements project, State Road 100 between U.S. 301 and the Alligator Creek Bridge will be closed for pavement marking installation nightly Tuesday, March 12 through Thursday, March 14, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The roadway will close at 8 p.m. each night and reopen by 6 a.m. the following morning. Each day traffic will be permitted between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m.

Detours are as follows:

State Road 100 eastbound will be closed at U.S. 301. Traffic will detour via U.S. 301 South to SE 144th Street (Hazen Street) and east on SE 144th Street to access State Road 100.

State Road 100 westbound will be closed at SE 144th Street. Traffic will detour via SE 144th Street West to U.S. 301 and north on U.S. 301 to access State Road 100.
