Subject: September 30, 2019 Access Management Hearing State Road 13 Median Modifications Jacksonville, Duval County, Florida

Dear Government Partner,

On behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), I invite you to a public hearing to discuss a proposed median modification on State Road 13/San Jose Boulevard. We will present the recommended improvements at the above-referenced public hearing.

First Coast Energy, LLP is requesting a permit to change a full median opening to a directional median opening on San Jose Boulevard between Marbon Road and Orange Picker Road as part of a project to construct a Daily's Convenience Facility at 12227 San Jose Boulevard. The proposed modifications are required by FDOT to reduce conflicts and meet current median opening spacing standards and would be funded by the private developer, not FDOT.

The hearing is Monday, September 30 at the South Mandarin Jacksonville Public Library, 12125 San Jose Boulevard, Jacksonville, Florida 32223. It will begin with an open house from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m., followed by a public comment period at 6:30 p.m. Attendees who complete a speaker's card will be given the opportunity to make an oral statement that will become part of the public hearing record. Persons wishing to submit written statements or other exhibits in place of or in addition to oral statements may do so at the hearing or by sending them to Julian McKinley, 838 Ellis Road S. Jacksonville, Florida 32205. All exhibits or statements postmarked on or before October 10, 2019 will become part of the public hearing record.

Project documents will be available for downloading from www.nflroads.com by September 30, 2019 and will be available at the public hearing.

Public participation is solicited without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, religion, disability or family status. Persons who require special accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act or who require translation services (free of charge) should contact Derrick Richardson at (904) 360-5457 at least seven days prior to the hearing.

This letter is being sent to all property owners within 300 feet of either side of the proposed median modification. Public hearings provide the public with an opportunity to express their views on the project, its potential for impact and other related matters. If you have questions
