Temporary Median Closure on S.R. 5 at Spencer Street Scheduled Next Week for Box Culvert Replacement Work

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) box culvert replacement project on S.R. 5 at Oyster Creek, a temporary median closure will be in place on S.R. 5 at Spencer Street Monday, May 16 through late 2022, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting. The median closure is necessary for construction crews to safely complete concrete and drainage work.

Northbound S.R. 5 traffic will be unable to turn left onto Spencer Street or turn left and travel northbound on S.R. 5 from Spencer Street. Drivers may use the next available median opening on S.R. 5 to travel northbound.

Superior Construction is expected to complete the \$4.6 million improvement project by early 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
