Traffic Pattern Changes Planned for Northbound Lanes of U.S. 17 at Dunn's Creek Bridge Starting July 22

PALATKA, Fla.- As part of the Dunn's Creek roadway widening project, a new traffic pattern will be in place for northbound lanes of U.S. 17 just south of Hoot Owl Road to just north of Horse Landing Road starting Thursday, July 22, weather and schedule permitting.

Northbound U.S. 17 traffic will be shifted to one lane across the existing Dunn's Creek Bridge. Southbound U.S. 17 traffic will remain one lane across the newly constructed Dunn's Creek Bridge. To safely shift traffic, flagging operations and lane closures will be necessary July 22 from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

GLF Construction is estimated to complete the \$36.5 million roadway widening [project](#) by fall 2021. Construction completion estimates are fluid and subject to change, weather and schedule permitting.


