Traffic Shift on Northbound State Road 21 to Begin June 18

MIDDLEBURG, Fla. – As part of the Florida Department of Transportation’s State Road 21 widening project between Long Bay Road and Allie Murray Road, northbound traffic will be shifted from the existing travel lanes left toward the center of the project area. The southbound lanes will remain in their current configuration.

Contractor R.B. Baker Construction Company is expected to complete the \$19.1 million project in late 2021, weather and schedule permitting.
