Traffic Advisory: Lane Closures Planned February 15-16 for Railroad Crossing Improvements

ALACHUA COUNTY, Fla. – Drivers should expect lane closures in Alachua County as part of the Statewide Traffic and Railroad Initiative Using Dynamic Envelopes initiative, officially known as “Operation STRIDE.”

Through [Operation STRIDE](#), the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is implementing rail crossing safety measures on state roadways with the goal of eliminating crashes at state road rail crossings. The work includes installation of Rail Dynamic Envelopes (conspicuous pavement markings), enhanced signage and rail safety education.

Construction will take place at the following locations from Monday, February 15 to Tuesday, February 16, weather permitting:

Alachua County

- Northwest 39th Avenue (State Road 222) west of Northeast 2nd Street - lane closures from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Work is expected to take place from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and lane closures will be removed early if work is completed ahead of schedule or could be in place longer due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.
