Traffic Advisory: Lane Closures and Detours Planned December 20 - 23 for Railroad Crossing Improvements

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Drivers should expect lane closures, flagging operations and detours in Duval County as part of the Statewide Traffic and Railroad Initiative Using Dynamic Envelopes initiative, officially known as “Operation STRIDE.”

Through [Operation STRIDE](#), the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is implementing rail crossing safety measures on state roadways with the goal of eliminating crashes at state road rail crossings. The work includes installation of Rail Dynamic Envelopes (conspicuous pavement markings), enhanced signage and rail safety education.

Construction will take place at the following locations from Sunday, December 20 to Wednesday, December 23, weather permitting:

- Edgewood Avenue (State Road 111) south of U.S. 90 – lane closures
- U.S. 90 (State Road 10) south of Walmsley Road – traffic will be detoured via Lane Avenue, I-10 and Cassat Avenue
- Zoo Parkway (State Road 105) east of North Main Street – traffic will be detoured via U.S. 17 (State Road 5), Imeson Park Boulevard and Busch Drive

Work is expected to take place from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. and once construction is completed at one crossing, crews will move to the next crossing and begin work. The lane closures will be removed early if work is completed ahead of schedule or could be in place longer due to weather or unforeseen circumstances.
