## U.S. 301 Truck Route Landscaping Project to Begin this Week

**STARKE, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation’s State Road 223 (U.S. 301) Truck Route Landscaping project is expected to begin this week, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.

The project consists of plantings and irrigation along SR 223 from southbound U.S. 301 to northbound U.S. 301.

Traffic will be maintained in accordance with FDOT design standards throughout the project. Lane closures will not be allowed between 6 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. within 600 feet of a signalized intersection on SR 223. Lane closures will not be allowed between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. within 600 feet of a signalized intersection on U.S. 301.

FDOT selected Arazoza Brothers Corporation to complete this \$3.5 million project in late 2023, weather and unforeseen circumstances permitting.
