UPDATE: Overnight Detours Planned Next Week at the State Road 207 and State Road 16 Ramps to and from I-95

ST. AUGUSTINE, Fla. – As part of resurfacing improvements on I-95 from State Road 207 to International Golf Parkway, closures of the State Road 207 ramps to and from I-95 are necessary for paving and shoulder treatment work to be completed. The ramp closures are scheduled overnight Sunday, June 23 through Tuesday, June 25 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. and will vary each night depending on paving production.

Additionally, closures of the State Road 16 ramps to and from I-95 are necessary for shoulder treatment work to be completed. The ramp closures are scheduled overnight Wednesday, June 26 and Thursday, June 27 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. and will vary each night depending on production. The detour routes are listed below.

- **State Road 207 Ramp to I-95 South.** During the closure, drivers on State Road 207 seeking to access I-95 South will use I-95 North and exit at State Road 16 to access I-95 South.
- **State Road 207 Ramp to I-95 North.** During the closure, drivers on State Road 207 seeking to access I-95 North will use I-95 South and exit at State Road 206 to access I-95 North.
- **State Road 207 Exit Ramp from I-95 North.** During the closure, drivers on I-95 North seeking to access State Road 207 will instead exit at State Road 16 to I-95 South to access State Road 207.
- **State Road 207 Exit Ramp from I-95 South.** During the closure, drivers on I-95 South seeking to access State Road 207 will instead exit at State Road 206 to I-95 North to access State Road 207.
- **State Road 16 Ramp to I-95 South.** During the closure, drivers on State Road 16 seeking to access I-95 South will use I-95 North and exit at International Golf Parkway to access I-95 South.
- **State Road 16 Ramp to I-95 North.** During the closure, drivers on State Road 16 seeking to access I-95 North will use I-95 South and exit at State Road 207 to access I-95 North.
- **State Road 16 Exit Ramp from I-95 South.** During the closure, drivers on I-95 South seeking to access State Road 16 will instead exit at State Road 207 to I-95 North to access State Road 16.
