
Wonderwood Connector Lane Closures and Detours Starting Sunday

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – As part of the first stage of the Wonderwood Drive (State Road 116) resurfacing project, one eastbound lane of McCormick Road from St. Johns Bluff Road to Broad Oak Drive will be closed continuously for approximately two months, starting Sunday night, July 10. In addition, Derringer Road at McCormick Road will be closed. Derringer Road traffic will detour south to Monument Road (map shown below).

Seven miles of the Wonderwood Connector, from east of the Southside Connector (State Road 113) to State Road A1A will undergo roadway reconstruction, resurfacing and pedestrian safety improvements. Construction will occur in five sections in three stages during the two-year project. Work on each half-mile to five-mile section will last approximately four to 10 months.

The speed limit has been reduced to 35 mph from east of the Southside Connector to Girvin Road and will be in effect through the duration of the project.

Bicyclists will use the full roadway when the existing bicycle lanes are reduced to accommodate work in the segments undergoing construction. “Bicycles May Use Full Lane” signs have been installed within the project limits.
